New beginnings in the New Year

Last month, a community member donated a vehicle to a SAFE family in need. The survivor, a mother of three with one more on the way, is a participant in SAFE's Transitional Housing Program and has struggled to meet her family's growing needs without having access to transportation.

Just a couple of weeks before the end of 2023, her wish came true when she was notified that SAFE had a vehicle for her, not just on a temporary basis, but to keep. The donors, who will remain anonymous, have made a vehicle donation to SAFE in the past when they upgraded cars. The donor said that they were considering selling their older model car before purchasing a new one this time, since the car was still in such good shape; however, after watching the Netflix series "Maid," a story about a young mother fleeing domestic violence, they decided that they wanted to donate their vehicle to a SAFE survivor again.

SAFE Program Staff are working with the participant on updating her driver's license, registering the vehicle and obtaining auto insurance, all things that are common needs when survivors come to SAFE. The lack of accessible public transportation in Ravalli County, along with the geographic distance that many survivors are facing when working with a variety of service providers, serve as major obstacles that this family no longer has to worry about, thanks to our generous donors.


